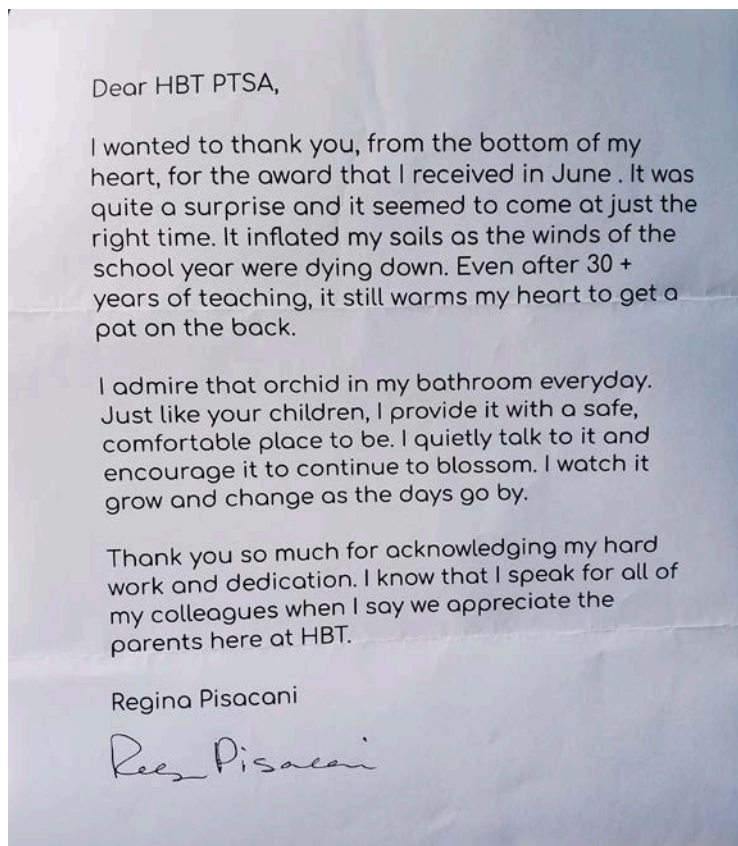

To give you an update since we last met, we had a few meetings over the summer with the administration and the new executive committee. V. Principal's Report: Presented by Mr. Harrigan, Mr. Naraine and Ms. Waters:

Mr. Bonanno – Hi everyone, welcome. Mrs. Ginsburg always starts with a pun or joke. Newcomers, bear with us. Events of the day will come at the end.

Start – 954 students as of 289 6th 354 in 7th and 311 in 8th grade. With staff, over 1100 people every day. A bit smaller than last year.

Transportation – AM buses are good, PM regular are good, but late PM are later than usual. Brings confusion in the circle at the time sports are ending. Still trying to manage with transportation. Very happy with regular pm

Sports – off and running even with the heat and rain. Kids are excited, picture day is Thursday and Friday in phys ed classes. Send them with a little nicer clothing.

Staff – Thanks to those staff joining us this evening. Michele Verre – Special Education and science teacher, as well as our PTSA liaison for several years, Daniella Baglivo from South Grove (new to HBT) and Ms. Regina Pisacani.

Secretary – Janice Knox (from Baylis) is our new addition in our main office. Feel free to welcome her.

Questions from parents –

- i. Yearbooks – quality control questions and mistakes last year – clubs haven't started, but met with yearbook advisors and some things were out of their control, but we are on it.
- ii. Recess & security – recess is in front of the building, 3 teachers in the room for every period plus 4-5 lunch monitors as well as principals. Head towards basketball and softball areas. One guard is out there at all times. One person always looking at point to see the parking lot. Nassau police have also been making regular stops. Most days see them here in the lot.
- iii. Fencing – Bid awarded to the company, walked with facilities director, head custodian and Principal Bonanno.
- iv. Lockout today – separate from synagogue situation – there was a car crash on 135 and a person was unable to be located; therefore, lockdown procedures were put in place. Lasted through 2 lunch periods, and was an hr in total. Police came in to see video footage (nothing was seen and guards watched). No evidence anyone was on this property. System definitely worked. If you are here during a lockout, standing outside is not the safest place to be. Being on the property is not ideal – please leave the property during a lockout. Dropping off lunch is not a priority at that point. We will make sure all children are fed.

Mr. Harrigan – Oversees 8th grade student activities and social studies.

Lunch – Any student can get lunch even if they do not have money, so no worries if you couldn't drop off lunch. Lunch is going well. Multiple accounts of being very inclusive to each other. We watch to see if some are sitting alone. There are places to go if someone needs some quiet time.

6th and 8th grade nooks – 2 classrooms are dedicated for those who will have lunch and some quiet time. Algebra, earth science workshops for 8th graders.

6th grade – workshop situation

7th grade – every major subject area has a workshop for additional support

Early in the Day – Last year, advisory was moved from the start to later in the day. Thus, being late to school impacts academic instruction. Bus ridership has improved greatly. Almost assuredly will arrive on time if you ride the bus. If they do not arrive on time, children are completely excused. Kids can walk or be dropped off, but need to be on time.

Clubs – Most clubs continue each year, some get adopted. Virtual club fair is in advisory this week. Recommend joining clubs, a great way for friendships to form. Clubs will start next week. Next Monday we are off, but Tuesday we start with clubs.

Wash D.C. – October 25-27. 263 or 264 students going. 25 teachers/administrators are going as well as several nurses to oversee medical needs. Rooming preference list went out today in Social Studies. Had information meeting last year. If you have any concerns, reach out to guidance counselors or Mr. Harrigan. 1 or 2 more parent meetings prior to the trip and answer any additional questions you may have. Those that don't go on the trip will have a good few days here. Mr. Naraine will also address.

Mr. Naraine – Always great following the board members and

End of August – Dropped my daughter off at college...and we know how it feels when we are not with them. We never lose sight of the responsibility to treat your kids like our kids. Our guiding motto (1) love, (2) acceptance (3) teach, in that order.

8th grade trip – Looking to add a trip in for those that are left behind. Sky zone or something for the remaining children. More to come on that.

Buses – New bus drivers, changing schedule, etc. Added routes to get buses here earlier. Last bus this afternoon came at 3:15. This is not acceptable and they were on the phone with transportation figuring out what went wrong and how we can get that bus here earlier.

Traffic – Please be careful in the parking lot – No pickups from the parking lot for safety reasons. We can't have children walking between cars/buses during pickup. Use the circle only.

Always around – We are always available to answer any questions/concerns and I am truly blessed to be part of this team.

Ms. Waters – I want to echo some of the themes – so happy to see how many people show up tonight despite the rain. I have 2 kids of my own (hs and middle schooler), so what happened today with a lockout, I understand the concern and wonder. I guarantee there was much more chatter among parents than the kids and teachers. Today, teachers kept teaching, hallways kept moving, etc. We are moving forward and proceeded like a normal school day and mostly they were unfazed. My office is in the guidance suite and am consistently talking with the mental health staff all day long. There was no uptick today in mental health visits/reported concerns. Thus, we want to reassure you all that we really are here and looking out for them. We love first and focus on social-emotional learning.

Question by Melissa Capie – If there was a real threat on the campus, what communication will we get?

Mr. Bonanno – there is a difference between Lockout vs lockdown – lockout – something going on outside and just being safe, ensuring no one can enter the building and cause a threat inside. The potential “threat” or concern is only on the outside of the building – that's why we do not want anyone on campus until that concern is resolved. Do not wait in the parking lot – go to a store, somewhere else, etc. Same is told to any returning staff if they are returning from lunch,

etc.

Lockdown – something is going on in the school – much more serious.

If we are managing something here, we are talking with police, Dr. Rogers, security, etc. All of those emergency plans take some time to get through and address – it never happens as fast as parents would like to get communication to them. Thus, please be patient (as difficult as it is) and let us get through our safety procedures and will get you communications as soon as it is practical for us to do so.

Query – to Ms. Waters – Is Dr. Laura DeGennaro now at the HS? Can changes like that be communicated to us parents? If there are changes to staffing, how is it communicated?

Ms. Waters – Although we try to communicate as much as possible especially with those situations with a personal connection, we may not reach everyone. There is quite often shifting of personnel between buildings when staffing needs arise, and if we identify any children where a relationship is impacted, we reach out. Of course, we ask parents to reach out if there is a relationship or impact we were not aware of.

Dr. Rodriguez is the new school psychologist and is reaching out.

VI. SPECIAL EVENT - BOE & District Administration Visit

Brian Grieco - We are here to say hi and if you have any questions, please let us know. We have a monthly board meeting, can ask questions – 10/3 is our next meeting (normally Mondays, even though this is a Tuesday).

Jack Ostrick – Excited to be informed about what is happening at the schools – always helpful to hear parents comments/concerns

Lynn Abramson – Love seeing everyone in person. Stay involved in your PTAs!

Shany Park – You have a great team here and if any issues, this administration is always available

Dr. Curry – Being a part of this learning community is amazing. Only an email or phone call away – very lucky to help with Dr. Rogers

Dr. Rogers – Starting my 10th year here. Fortunate to have an extraordinary team here at hbt and the board is amazing and what to do with our facilities maintenance and enrollment growth. Our successor mascot discussions are underway.

Fence contractor did the walk last Thursday, had a survey completed, also want to discuss we don't want to cut back to much of the greenery. A chain link fence should be able to be done quickly once we are on the schedule.

Parent Question – What is the progress and priority on the HBT vestibule?

Ans - School Board has considered it and is within those priorities, and reviewing over the next few months. A bigger vestibule would be better along with a visiting window.

Parent Question – Is there any program in place of thanking the 2nd precinct for their responsiveness and assistance on campus?

Ans - Mr. Bonanno/Ms. Verre – Thanked our “lifesavers” the last few years. We have students take part in programs to thank them.

Dr. Rogers – At the District level, we have a lot of communication with the 2nd precinct and we take every opportunity to thank them.

Superintendent's Report

Student Achievement Data – Loverso & Goldthwaite

- Major Curriculum Shifts since 2015. Laying the foundation in ELA – invested in new materials, classroom libraries, and professional development through Reader's and Writer's Workshop; in Math – adoption of Go Math at elementary and middle schools; in Science – shift to inquiry-based and hands on labs. Work in MTSS will be given next month.
- Syosset students Districtwide Grades 3-8 have had an overall positive trend of increased proficiency over the past years in ELA, Math, and Science. Upward trajectory can be attributed to the implementation of workshop model of instruction for ELA. For Math, we moved from operational math (formulaic approach) to conceptual math (deeper understanding of principles).
- Syosset students outperform the county and state in Math, ELA, and Science.
- What's next: ongoing exploration of student interventions to meet student needs, increased participation in advanced English classes
- Grades 8-9 Transition Data: District worked on lowering the data of drop from Honors Geometry

School Bus cameras – are not operational; new County and TOB administrations do not want to run the stop arm program. Cameras were installed and may be turned on when servicing other Districts in other towns but not in Syosset

Start Time – Preferred Bell Times

Mascot Selection Process

We will have concerted community engagement using Surveys to hone our community values and mascot traits then form an Advisory Committee

Facilities Priorities

- Bond Roll Off in 2025-26
- Potential new residential developments may still be possible
- Estimated cost of debt service: If \$10 million debt à increase \$27.20 per \$10,000 in taxes per year
- Woodbury School for Offices Analysis (5,800 sq ft is what is needed for office)
 - Swing space for other office from other buildings
 - Generate state aid by housing some kind of student program (E.g.: SCOPE, after school sports that can make use of a half court)

Discussion Items:

SHS start time

- A trustee suggested redoing the poll to the public and attaching school ID so multiple votes by one use would not be done. Majority of the trustees decided to keep the SHS start time unchanged. Seems too difficult to completely revamp; revisit in the future if logistics change
- A trustee advocated that a vestibule at HBT should be added to the priority bucket in facilities work to be done
- A trustee raised the question if it is a goal that we look to be fair vis-à-vis the 2 middle schools, should we look at building out a track for HBT, as SW has one

Purchases can be made in cash, debit/credit cards and e-wallet. Please make sure you log into your account and you can fund the current year's e-wallet with the gift card so that it can be used at the upcoming book fair. Scholastic will send an email to all parents who have balances with instructions on how to do this, so be sure to check your emails/spam folders.

There will also be another pre-sale for the Diary of a Wimpy Kid, "No Brainer", which will go on sale to the public on October 24th. Any purchases of books not on site (like Diary of a Wimpy Kid) will be delivered to your children during class when the books arrive at the school (usually around a week after the fair is over).
